## AP Testing



April 13, 2017

All AP exams have been ordered and students will be responsible for either taking the exam(s) or paying an additional \$15 fee for each returned exam if they do not show up for the exam. The \$15 obligation fee must be paid prior to graduation if you are a graduating senior.

All AP exams will be taken at Lanier High School. Students will receive notice prior to the exam as to exact room location. Please arrive on time to your exam: **Arrive at 7:00 a.m. for the morning administration, and at 11:00 a.m. for the afternoon administration**. Students may not be dismissed until an exam has officially ended; do not ask to leave early if you finish before the end of the exam. If you play a sport or have a job, it is your responsibility to inform your coach or employer of your AP Exam obligation, and arrangements should be made accordingly. Whether you are registered for a morning or an afternoon exam, you will be excused for the entire day.

A few important items:

- An AP exam trumps EOC tests. If you have an EOC at the same time as your AP exam, you will take the EOC on the make-up date. Mrs. Seay will send notices to these students for make up dates/times.
- You will be marked ACT for the entire day of the AP exam.
- You may bring water and a snack. You will be able to reach these items during the 10 minute break between sections.

Please read the following information carefully for exam day instructions:

**You should bring the following items to the exam room:**

- A government-issued or school-issued photo ID.
- Several sharpened No. 2 pencils (with erasers) for completing multiple-choice answer sheets.
- Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams.
- A watch- NO SMART WATCHES are permitted
- Up to two calculators with the necessary capabilities if you are taking an AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics Exam. (Visit [www.collegeboard.com/ap/calculators](http://www.collegeboard.com/ap/calculators) to learn more about the calculator policy for each of these exams, and for a list of authorized calculators.)
- A ruler or straightedge only if you are taking an AP Physics Exam. (Protractors are not allowed.)

**You should NOT bring the following to the exam room:**

- NO Electronic equipment: (cell phone, smart phone, tablet computer, etc.), portable listening or recording devices (MP3 player, iPod, etc.), cameras or other photographic equipment, devices that can access the Internet, and any other electronic or communication devices.
- Unapproved aids: Books, compasses, mechanical pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, notes or colored pencils.
- Scratch paper
- Computers or calculators (except as noted above).
- Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- Watches that beep or have an alarm, or smartwatches.
- Clothing with subject-related information.

You are required to abide by the policies of both the College Board and Lanier High School during the exam period. Any misconduct will be reported and could jeopardize your AP Exam score. If you decide not to take an exam, please inform me as soon as possible prior to the test administration.

AP exam dates are May 1<sup>st</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>.
